


# A Message from Pastor Jenny

*When Jesus had finished speaking, he said to Peter Simon, 'Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch.'* (Luke 5:4)

"Come on!" I called to my little sister. "No, that's OK. I'm good here." She continued to paddle back and forth near the shore, but I wanted to see how far I could go. I continued swimming: first a breaststroke but when breathing became labored, I flipped to a backstroke raining drops of water onto my face, then I paused in a shredding motion breathing hard and heart pounding to check out how far I had gone. Maybe 20 yards. That's it? I started swimming again and again I stopped to look how far I had come. 15 yards now? It had been years since I had swum, but with a house that backed up to Table Rock Lake, how could I resist? It was the first day of our family vacation in Branson, Missouri and I coaxed my sister to come and swim with me.

Looking back, that first swim was exhilarating. I didn't know how far my body would carry me before I conceded to turning around. I didn't know what other creatures were swimming in the water. I didn't know what to expect. Not knowing is part of the lure to put out into the deep water. Peter Simon didn't know what to expect when Jesus told him to put out into deep waters. He knew how to rig the boat, set the nets, and haul in fish. He knew he had been trying to catch fish all night but had caught nothing. He knew a lot about fishing, but he didn't know who was telling him to put out into the deep waters. He didn't know what was possible when he worked with Jesus. He didn't know where this instruction would lead. Not knowing is part of the lure. Jesus had hooked Peter's curiosity and reeled in his trust that day.

For the last six months, Calvary's council has been dwelling with this passage from Luke 5 at the beginning of each meeting. Like Peter Simon and his crew, we know how to rig the church for worship. We know how to care for one another in difficult times. We know how to set the calendar and haul in friends and guests for special events. We know how to do church, but the water has changed around us. The culture has shifted while we were



doing the things we know how to do. Regular church attendance is no longer considered weekly but monthly. Other interests compete with worship and volunteering at church. The water has changed, but the invitation from Jesus hasn't. Put out into deeper water. The council leaders agreed that it's scary and uncomfortable putting out into deep water (especially for us shorter members who would rather stay where our feet touch the bottom!) We don't know how far we can go with our resources. We don't know what we'll find swimming in the water with us. We don't know what is possible when we work with Jesus. Not knowing is part of the lure. Don't you want to see how far we can go?

On that first day of vacation, I made it back to the shore exhausted but refreshed. I had swum all the way to the second floating dock. Before I turned around, I took a break to rest. I laid on my back and floated on the water. The light blue sky stretched over me brushing the tops of the trees on the outcrop of the peninsula. Swallows dived past me catching breakfast off the lake while I rested, buoyed by the water. I started vacation by putting out into deep waters and returned to the shore and returned home with a renewed spirit and a deep peace buoyed by the grace of God. What will we find when we put out into deep waters?



# Northern NJ Lutheran Youth Co-Op: AWAKE-A-THON

**Who:** The Northern New Jersey Lutheran Youth Co-Op. Any ELCA youth entering 9<sup>th</sup> grade in the fall or finishing 12<sup>th</sup> grade (Friends are welcome too!)

**What:** Awak-a-thon (see description below)

**When:** Saturday, July 13<sup>th</sup> at 9 am—Sunday, July 14<sup>th</sup> at 9 am

**Where:** Begins and ends at Calvary Lutheran Church in Allendale. We will travel to Ramapo Reservation, Star of Hope Ministries in Paterson, Garden State Plaza, and State Line Diner.

**Why:** To be generous together! Serve the community, share kindness, and stay awake to earn pledges for a charity. This year's charity is Camp Koinonia! The heart of any awake-a-thon is service. It begins before the event itself when youth invite members of their congregation to make pledges for each hour they can stay awake. Once the 24-hour event begins, we will help with a service project and also watch for ways to share "Random Acts of Kindness." The day and evening will be packed with fun events like hiking, scavenger hunt at the mall, midnight devotions, desserts at the dinner, dance party, games, campfire worship, and more as we try to stay awake together!
